From the Pastor...

Imagine it in your mind's eye. Everywhere you look there are people. They are waving banners and shouting at the top of their lungs and clapping until their hands are raw. And you're there too, a voice among the multitudes, waving, shouting, and clapping. But why all this joy? Well, the King of Kings is coming. He's the greatest king of all. And he's not the greatest because he is a tyrant like some Middle East dictator who will put you through an industrial shredder if you don't cheer him. You praise your King because his rule is a rule of grace.

It is possible that this Psalm 47 was written for a special event in Israel's history. For years after the Israelites moved into the promised land, Jerusalem was still in heathen hands. Finally, King David conquered Jerusalem and his son Solomon built a temple to the Lord there. The dedication of the temple gave the Ark of the Covenant – the symbol of the

presence of the King of Kings among his people – a permanent home. Hence the words about the King going up amid shouts of joy.

But these words have a different application for us. God has promised us a permanent home in heaven. And that is so amazing because it's something that we don't deserve. We so often have different "kings" ruling our lives. Sometimes its popularity. We want attention and if we do something we want it to be well known and get everyone else's attention. Sometimes money is king. All we can think of is how much we do or don't have and those thoughts occupy our minds. Finally, we can just say that anytime we disobey the Lord, we are putting ourheart's selves on our throne where the Lord should be.

What we don't remember is that those "kings" rules with an iron fist. All of them push us to a home that we really want no part of. In Romans 5 we

hear that, "Just as sin entered the world through one man, and death through sin, in this way death came to all men because all sinned. The home we deserve because of sin is eternal death.

But Jesus, the king of grace will bring us to a home that is very different. We are no longer under the rule of sin. We see his grace when we see him remaining silent and not taking any opportunity to defend himself as he was unjustly accused and executed on the cross. We see his grace as we see his empty tomb. That is how Jesus freed us from the rule of sin. That is how Jesus can promise us a home in heaven.

And that's what he's preparing for us even now. It is not a place of pain and sadness. It is a place of eternal rest. That's one reason why we celebrate today. Jesus is keeping the promise that he made to his disciples when he said that he was going to his Father's place and there he would prepare places for all of God's people. Yes, he's getting a place ready for you right now.

But that's not all he's doing. From 1014-1035 AD there was a king in England named Canute. There is a legend that he got tired of the members of his royal court flattering him constantly with praises about his greatness. So one day he ordered his throne to be set at the seashore, where he sat and commanded that the waves wouldn't come in and get him wet. But no matter how forcefully he commanded the tide not to come in, his order was not obeyed. He got wet. One historian tells us that afterward he never wore his king's crown, but instead hung it on a statue of Jesus, the King who rules all things.

Gone are the days when people in power make such a clear statement about who is really in control. And really, the way things are going in this world we might wonder who is really in control. But take heart. Jesus, right now is at his Father's right hand, a position of power and prestige, not a position of sitting back and doing nothing.

You might be thinking, "Give me proof of this rule of Jesus. I just don't see it." Maybe we don't see it because we're looking in the wrong places for it. We actually don't have to look too far to see his kingdom. Whenever we are gather in worship around the word shows Jesus' kingdom is still going. If evil were winning, we wouldn't be here. And what's happening here is happening throughout the world. Jesus is ruling this world so that his gospel continues to go out.

But that's not the only proof of Jesus' rule. It might seem like evil rules everything now. But that's only temporary. Jesus is coming back to judge. And evil and evildoers will be declared guilty. They won't be able to escape judgment. They won't be able to cop a plea for a lesser sentence. They will be locked in hell forever. We, whose sins have been taken away, won't have that same fate. We'll spend eternity in a place where evil and evildoers can't touch us. What a day that will be when we get there!

'All you peoples, clap your hands!
Shout to God! Sing a loud song!

'Yes, the LORD Most High is awesome.
He is the great King over all the earth!

'He subdues peoples under us
and nations under our feet.

'He chooses our inheritance for us.
It is the pride of Jacob, whom he loves.

'God has ascended with a joyful shout.

The LORD goes up with the sound of the ram's horn. (Psalm 47:1-5)



Friends and Family of Gloria Dei,




