less than our budget. Please prayerfully consider how your offerings and gifts may better help our congregational financial needs.

This balance between present needs and future ones usually creates no small tension when dealing with worldly matters. However, when it comes to spiritual matters, our gracious Lord assures us that he has all of our needs on the entire time line of our lives covered. After all, he is "I AM," the eternal God who is with us now and is still with us in eternity. Should we be surprised that the blessings which come from his grace are similarly timely and eternal?

At times we struggle spiritually, feeling like we are losing our battles with temptation and wondering if we are growing more and more distant from God. At such times, God encourages us with these words from Romans: "Since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have gained access by faith into this grace in which we now stand" (5:1,2). Yes, we stand in God's grace at this very moment, in this present life! Such constant grace empowers us to keep fighting in faith right now and not give up. To make us certain that these gifts will not change in the future but will only increase, Peter also writes, "Set your hope on the grace to be brought to you when Jesus Christ is revealed at his coming" (I Peter I:13). Eternity doesn't bring fewer blessings; it provides a deliverance from this world that far outweighs our present difficulties and uncertainties.

True to the boundless riches of God's grace, we are not caught in an either/or situation, but we enjoy the full benefits of his grace, both for the present and for eternity. Because you stand in God's grace through Christ, you have a completed peace with God. Because Jesus is returning to bring you to heaven, you have future blessings of grace to anticipate eagerly. Only God's grace, and his grace alone, can be sufficient to give us perfect peace now and perfect hope for all eternity.

With this understanding we joyfully and willing give to the One who has given us all that we have – our daily bread and his never-ending grace.



As we get nearer to the time of Christmas, we know that we will have a lot of charities that we run across seeking donations. We get requests in the mail. We see newspapers being "sold" at intersections. There are the boxes for "Coats for Kids" at the gym. And of course, all of us are familiar with the bell ringers standing outside our favorite mega-mart.

All these charities do wonderful things for people. They help children. They assist people who have fallen on hard times. They give a hand to people who have let their lives go to get back on the right track and get their lives in order again. All these goals are fantastic. And if you — as individuals or as families — take time to contribute to a charity as part of your Christmas celebration, that's wonderful!

As we make those donations, we feel good inside because we have given something of ours to help others. But let's think about that for a minute. While we think of the possessions that are a part of our lives as "ours," in reality, what we have – everything we have – isn't really ours at all. "The earth is the LORD's and everything in it," we are told in Psalm 24. Everything that we have – our cars, our homes, our food, our furniture, our golf clubs, our toys, our TV's and whatever might be in our bank accounts – isn't ours. It belongs to our Lord, who has blessed us with all that we have and gives us all of it to use wisely while we are in this world. And we can use it for many things – for our enjoyment and entertainment, to provide for ourselves and our families, and for charity.

But the greatest opportunity that our Lord hands us is the opportunity to give a portion of what he has given us back to him. What we give back to him is what is used to carry out the gospel ministry, a ministry that he has not entrusted to individual pastors, but his whole Church. This is the work of the Bride of Christ in the world, bringing the gospel message to people who don't know about Jesus and continuing to nourish and strengthen those who know Jesus through worship and Bible Study.

While charities do fantastic work to help people, it's the lifeline of the gospel that all people need. Continuing to herald that good news in this world is a more important goal than ending hunger or curbing juvenile delinquency or making sure that kids have gifts under the tree. Don't misunderstand – I'm not saying this to say that donating to such charities is bad or that you should stop giving to them and give more in the offering plate. These are real physical needs that people have and it is wonderful to help them

Where the gospel is different is that it fills the greatest need that anyone could ever have – that the Lord would show such love and grace to us by not only providing us with everything we have in this life but for giving us everything we need to spend eternity with him in heaven. It's the story of God's Son emptying himself, willingly leaving

the rich paradise of heaven and making himself poor. It's the story of how Jesus gave his life on the cross so that we could have the riches of God's perfection given to us. It's the story of the conquest of all evil that stands against us so that we will partake in heaven's eternal victory celebration

How blessed we are to have heard that story! How blessed we are to know just how much our God loves us! And how blessed we are that he now uses us to carry out his work of sharing that message in this world! God doesn't need our help. He's God. He can do anything. But in his love he blesses us to be the instruments that he uses to point others to his love. What joy this brings to our hearts!

And in this joy our Lord moves us to want to continue that work in this world by giving a portion of what he has given us back to him. His love answers any doubts in our hearts, doubts that go something like, "Well, if I give something back to God, I'll have less for me. There's a lot of inflation going on right now. It sure seems like the economy isn't going to be all that good in the future." To that our Lord says, "Why would I make you suffer because of what you give back to me to support my gospel message? I have already given you the greatest treasure of all — my own Son. I give you forgiveness. I give you eternal life. I want you to be my instrument in this world. What I will do is continue to bless you so that you can continue to abound in generosity until you enjoy the riches that heaven offers. That's my promise to you. Trust me."

As you consider what you may donate to charities this Christmas season, don't forget to consider how you will also use what God has given to support his work here at Gloria Dei – all that we do locally and globally as members of the Wisconsin Synod. As you give back to him in thanksgiving for what he has done for you, watch with awe what he accomplishes through it as you carry these words close to your hearts:

⁷Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. ⁸ And God is able to bless you abundantly, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work. ⁹ As it is written: "They have freely scattered their gifts to the poor; their right-eousness endures forever." ¹⁰ Now he who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will also supply and increase your store of seed and will enlarge the harvest of your righteousness. ¹¹ You will be enriched in every way so that you can be generous on every occasion, and through us your generosity will result in thanksgiving to God. (2 Corinthians 9:7-
